
Welcome to Larry Scott Memorial Park

Larry Scott was one of the devoted members of the “Church of the Rear Derailleur,” a group of bicyclists named for the mechanism on a bike that changes gears. This group of avid cyclists formed the Peninsula Trails Coalition in 1988 and began a grassroots effort to make the old rail corridor a hiking, walking, biking, and horse trail. When Larry died from cancer in 1991, the county commissioners officially designated the greenway trail as Larry Scott Memorial Park.



Three miles of the trail are completed and work on 3.5 miles from Highway 20 to Discovery Bay Golf Course is scheduled to begin this spring. The Larry Scott Trail will eventually extend almost 8 miles to Four Corners. One day you will be able to take that same route east to Glacier National Park and west to the Pacific Coast, as the Larry Scott Trail will be part of the Pacific Northwest Trail and the Olympic Discovery Trail.
